

# All About Respect (Lesson Plan)

## Narwhals & Waterfalls

### Grade Level

PreK-5th Grade

### Learning Objective

I can demonstrate relationship skills and responsible decision-making skills through learning practical ways to respect others.

### Demonstration of Learning

Given the "Respect" worksheets, I can demonstrate knowledge of relationship skills through writing.

Given the partner activities, I can demonstrate responsible decision-making and relationship skills through role play.

- **Greetings:**
  - Greet students at the beginning of class with a high-five/air-five, handshake, dance, smile, or whatever they choose!
- **Circle Time**
- **Listen** to "All About Respect" by Narwhals & Waterfalls
- **Discussion:**
  - What are some ways people were showing respect in the video?
  - What does Respect mean to you?
- **Q&A Partner Listening Activity:** Explain that we can show respect to others by listening while they talk. Cut out N&W flashcards, and give each partner group a set. Direct students to listen carefully to their partner's answers, as they will need to share their partner's answers with the class. Set a timer for 3 minutes for the first partner to answer, and 3 minutes for the next partner to answer. Students share their partner's answers with the class.
- **Worksheet Activity:**
  - Have students fill out the "Ways We Can Show Respect" worksheet.
- After the worksheet is complete, ask students to share their answers about other ways they could show respect.
- **Movement Activity:**
  - Listen to the song and have students act out the key concepts as the song plays. Ask them to create partner dance moves for the chorus "It's all about Respect, all about respect, all about respect to show you care."
- **Writing Activities**
  - Project the "Respect fill-in-the-blank" worksheet and/or print it out for students. Complete it as a group or as individuals.
  - Use the "Let's Share Respect" letter templates for students to write letters to someone who has shown respect to them.
